Over the last few weeks, we have been following a worship and sermon series prepared by *A Sanctified Art*, titled *What Do You Fear?* I have received wonderful feedback from you all, both positive (in that many have found this series to be meaningful for them) and with constructive criticism (ways that future series can be even better). Thank you to everyone who has engaged the series and shared their thoughts and experiences.

When Pastor Ryan, Pastor Ken and I first started looking at the series to do together, we felt that some of the wording and themes were a little heavy-handed. Despite some of these misgivings, we decided to push on and give the series a good ol' college try. What I learned during this series is that boldly naming the realities of our lives can be more helpful than hurtful. As humans, we often try to push away the realities of the fear we feel in response to various circumstances. Yet, by giving voice to these fears, we can bear them together and take away some of the power they hold over us.

This reminder that we do not bear our fears alone is so timely. We began Advent just a week and a half after the longest Federal Government shutdown in history ended. Many people were still trying to get back on their feet as federal benefits were slowly being phased back in. Peace, as well as its ELCA sister congregations in Billings, provided significant help to people in need of food, toiletries, and financial assistance. The people suffering did not need to carry their fear alone.

Christmas Eve was once again nestled in the realities of life. Families gathered together to celebrate, even as they experienced conflict and other stressors. Reports of violence in our community, nation, and around the world showed that the birth of our savior did not bring quick fixes to our individual and communal sins.

The joy of the holiday, balanced with the grief, the loneliness, the pain we carry, was on display. To this reality, we spoke the hope that Jesus brings in his birth and the persistence of faith in the face of our fears. The people who walked in darkness saw a great light, the light of Christ who bears the sins of the world.

On the first weekend of the New Year, we will conclude this series with our celebration of Epiphany. We'll hear the story of the visit from the wise men, how they travelled together to share the anticipation of meeting the newborn king. We'll hear again how Herod meant to trick them, but that God sent them home by another road, so they could carry the hope they had found to the people of the day. We'll have a liturgy around Star Words, a concept that these words can help shape our experience of the year, a word that travels with you to inform your spiritual growth through the year. We will finish the way we started, remind each other that we do not walk this path of life alone.

As we begin another circuit around the sun, I'd like to bless you with the words we have closed our Advent, Christmas, and Epiphany worships with:

In a fearful world,/ may you look for God's spirit./ May you reach for each other's hands./ May you choose courage whenever you can./ And in all things, may you remember/ that good news is louder than fear.

In the name of the one who calls,/ the one who sends,/ and the one who journeys with— go in peace and/ be not afraid./ Amen.

Peace Lutheran Financial Update

October was our second biggest giving month (after August- \$28,000+) in 2025! Thank you to everyone who has given to the general fund and especially to designated offerings such as the Food Pantry and to Youth Fundraiser (individual checks and Lutefisk Dinner). Much of the uptick in designated giving happened in November with the uncertainty regarding SNAP benefits and the Federal Government shutdown. We do not measure designated giving on this table, as this reflects just the general fund. If we did show a measure of designated giving, it would be through the roof!

You also see that our budget deficit has been shrinking through the Fall Months. It is our expectation that as we move into the Holidays, with year-end giving and generosity, we will likely see a much smaller deficit at end-of-year, or even another surplus! Thank you for your continued generosity to the church.

WORSHIP THEMES**January 3 & 4, 2026**

Within the gospel reading's profound words lies the simple message that God is revealed in a human person. Though we may try to understand how the Word existed with God from the beginning of time, the wonder we celebrate at Christmas is that the Word continues to dwell among us. Christ comes among us in the gathered assembly, the scriptures, the waters of new birth, and the bread and the wine. Through these ordinary gifts we receive the fullness of God's grace and truth.

Jeremiah 31:7-14, Psalm 147:12-20, Ephesians 1:3-14, John 1: (1-9) 10-18

January 10 & 11, 2026

In the waters of the Jordan, Jesus is revealed as the beloved Son of God. Through this great epiphany, Jesus fulfills all righteousness and becomes the servant of God who will bring forth justice and be a light to the nations. In the waters of baptism we too are washed by the Word, anointed by the Spirit, and named God's beloved children. Our baptismal mission is to proclaim good news to all who are oppressed or in need of God's healing.

Isaiah 42:1-9, Psalm 29, Acts 10:34-43, Matthew 3:13-17

January 17 & 18, 2026

Today's gospel opens with further reflection on Jesus' baptism. He is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world and the one anointed by the Spirit. In the liturgy we come and see Christ revealed among us in word and meal. We go forth to invite others to come and worship the Holy One and to receive the gifts of grace and peace made known among us.

Isaiah 49:1-7, Psalm 40:1-11, 1 Corinthians 1:1-19, John 1:29-42

January 24 & 25, 2026

Jesus begins his public ministry by calling fishers to leave their nets and follow him. In Jesus the kingdom of God has come near. We who have walked in darkness have seen a great light. We see this light most profoundly in the cross—as God suffers with us and all who are oppressed by sickness, sin, or evil. Light dawns for us as we gather around the word, the font, and the holy table. We are then sent to share the good news that others may be "caught" in the net of God's grace and mercy.

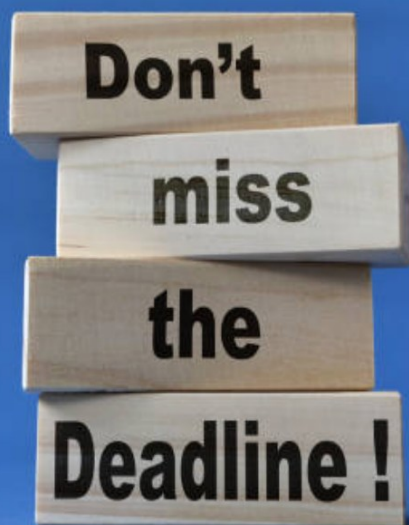

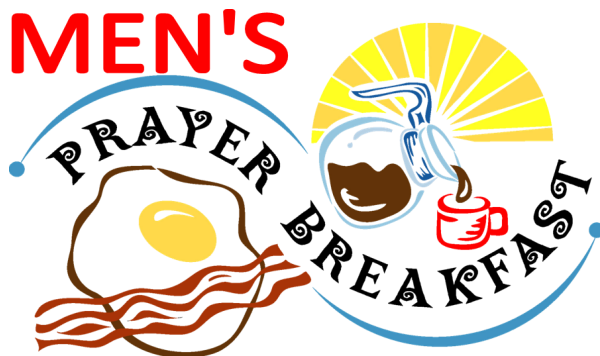
