Peace Quilters News!



Will they discern Katrina's and my "firmness born of care?" Will they sense their memory-making is just as important to us as it is to them? Will they look back on these days with grace for their parents, who eventually had to call them in from their play?

Aside from the nostalgia this poem evokes, what really grips me is the way the writer connects the summer evening play imagery to the sunset of life. The final line, "God knows how much I want to stay," brings this metaphor home for me.

If we can conceive of our lives as creative play, sharing with our family, friends, and loved ones in making meaning together as we explore the world God has given us, we may be able to see that every day of our lives are like those summer nights of our youth. God as parent is one who treads the line between letting us wander and learn, while also providing boundaries for our safety. Eventually, just as our mother or father or other adult in our lives called us home for the evening, God our parent will eventually call us home to the eternal comfort that is awaiting all of us.

God knows, just as I know for my children, that we want to stay in this "serious business of play." And God, in infinite love, calls us home from our play at just the right time.

As Council looked at the March financial report, we were pleased to see the largest month of giving so far in 2025. We were also able to keep our costs for the month lower, as we fulfilled most of our contract fees for the new year in January and February. While we are still nearly \$10,000 behind in giving Year-To-Date, Easter was in April and we expect to see most, if not all, of the Year-To-Date deficit be covered by the extra giving that happens on Easter.

This note gives a good opportunity to remind us all that we do not receive our financial reporting for a month until the first or second week of the following month. Although this is the May newsletter, we will not receive April financials until about three weeks after the Newsletter deadline. This is why we will be a month behind in the newsletter reporting of financial information. You can see giving statistics for the preceding two weeks in each worship bulletin. You can also come to the office anytime to ask for a fuller budget report if you would like.

I was reading Isaiah 58:6-9 during my Lenten devotion ~

"Is not this the fast that I choose:

To loose the bonds of injustice, to undo the thongs of the yoke,

To let the oppressed go free, and to break every yoke?

Is it not to share your bread with the hungry, and bring the homeless poor into your house?"

That last one stopped me. To bring the homeless poor into my house? Nope. I can't do that. That just doesn't sound like a good idea.

But then I thought about **Family Promise**, a place for homeless in our community to come to our house at Peace. I thought about things I *can* do. I *can* be part of a program that helps families find homes, shares bread, beds, and space with those people until they do find a home. That is a sacrifice I *can* make. And in that, I see God's grace in all the people involved ~ guests and hosts.

Thanks to everyone who helped with Family Promise in March! Deanna, Natalie, Melissa, Amelia, Linda, Paul, Weyland, Dwight, Ruby, Ann, Rhonda, Jody, Kinsley, Deb, Pastor Seth, Molly, Margie and Sharon. We had a full house and really appreciated everyone's help with setup, laundry, tear down, food, overnights. (Again, I hope I didn't miss anyone ~ remember ~ there's a volunteer sign in sheet that everyone needs to sign when they help! It's usually in the kitchen by the stove).

Our next **Family Promise** week is **May 18-25**. We will know more about how many guests we will have the week before. The sign up board will be in the narthex beginning May 4.

Also ~ Please consider donating diapers, wipes and/or cash to the **Family Promise and United Way Diaper Drive!** 1 in 4 parents miss work because they can't afford the diapers required to provide for their children while in childcare. Diapers and wipes keep babies AND moms healthy! And it's Mother's Day month! What a gift we give when we help Mom's with diapers for their children. Bring the diapers (and wipes) to Peace the weekend of May 3 and 4 (or during the week by May 7) and we will get them to Family Promise.



- 4 "[Peter] said to [Jesus], 'Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Feed my sheep'" (John 21:17). Ask God to help us align our expressions of faith and love for God with how we respect, love and care for our neighbors in need and our siblings in Christ.
- 5 Thank God for the ELCA's special relationship with the United Church of Christ, a full communion partner since 1997. Pray for the church, its members and its leaders, that together we will find strength and resources for the work of sharing the gospel and serving our neighbor.

- 7 Sing praises and give thanks to God for being our strength in all circumstances and for attending to our need for help, renewal and encouragement

- 11 Mother's Day Pray for mothers, stepmothers, foster mothers and expectant mothers. Pray for women who struggle with parenting, who are trying to conceive or who cannot bear children of their own but serve as loving and faithful adults in the lives of children and youth.
