When I began as your pastor back in late spring of early 2022, I was coming off a year-long interim call in Northern Idaho, which served as a soft landing after my first call in Northeastern Washington ended in conflict. I was very excited to start a new chapter with a new congregation, but I also had a number of reservations. Was I really called to be a pastor? Why would this faith community want me to join and lead them? What if things went sideways in this new place? What would that say about me?

For your part, you had some reservations as well. Do we want this young of a pastor? Why does he dress like that, wear long hair, and have tattoos? Is he equipped to do the job we want him to do? As we've grown together over the last few years, I think most of the reservations that we brought to this relationship have been resolved. There have continued to be growing edges and conflicts, but for the greatest part, we're continuing to work together to notice and bring about the kingdom of God in our little slice of creation here in Billings Montana.

One of the reasons I think this relationship has worked is that both the congregation and I have been willing to learn from one another and learn about each other. One way this has come about is through my participation in a program in the ELCA called "Natural Systems Academy. Since October 2022, I have been attending a quarterly meeting in Chicago and online, in which I work with pastors, synod staffs, and bishops from across the country in studying Bowen Family Systems Theory. The gist of this program is the understanding that how you interact and relate to your family of origin is how you carry yourself in various other situations, circumstances, and relationships in your life.

My study of Bowen Theory, written reflections on my family of origin and how it relates to my actions, emotions, and reflexes, and case studies I have presented about challenges I face in my life and in my ministry have all helped me grow and learn how to be the healthiest and best husband, father, son, brother, friend, and pastor I can be.

While the results of this work can be difficult to share in tangible ways, I am certain one of the reasons our ministry together as Pastor and congregation is going well is because of the work I have done both with the ELCA "Natural Systems Academy" and my individual Bowen Coach I meet with on a monthly basis.

This is a long way of saying thank you. Since the fall of 2022, Peace Lutheran has invested in my growth and learning by increasing my continuing education budget to help pay for this training. As I prepare to graduate the "Natural Systems Academy" in June of 2026, I have been reflecting on where I have been, where I am going, and how I am getting there. ## Peace Lutheran Financial Update

December 2025	\$19,413.18	\$23,550.37	-4,137.19
2025 Year-To-Date	\$249,618.02	\$253,798.86	-4,180.84

As you likely saw in our Annual Report, Giving was lower than expected in December 2025, which ultimately brought us to an annual deficit of just under \$4,200. This represents a 1.6% deficit for the year. While not ideal, the council was not concerned about this small deficit. We project each year a "break-even" budget, and for 2026, our budgeted expenses are right in line with 2025 income. The Annual Report will continue to be available in its digital form on our website through the month of February, and in paper copy as long as there remain copies available. Please look at the budget reports on pages 36-39 for more information.

Thank you to everyone who continues to give generously to the church. We understand that there are financial stressors affecting you all and appreciate your giving, no matter how much you are able to share with the congregation. Giving has been strong so far in January 2026 and we will report those numbers in the March Newsletter. We look forward to continuing the strong, important work God has placed before us in 2026 and beyond!

**WORSHIP THEMES****January 31 & February 1st**

Who are the blessed ones of God? For Micah, they are those who do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with God. For Paul, they are the ones who find wisdom in the weakness of the cross. For Jesus, they are the poor, the meek, the merciful, the pure in heart, the peacemakers, those who mourn, and those who hunger for righteousness. In baptism we find our blessed identity and calling in this countercultural way of living and serving.

**Micha 6:1-8, Psalm 15, 1 Corinthians 1:18-31, Matthew 5:1-12**

**February 7th & 8th**

Light shines in the darkness for the upright, the psalmist sings. Isaiah declares that when we loose the bonds of injustice and share our bread with the hungry, the light breaks forth like the dawn. In another passage from the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus, the light of the world, calls his followers to let the light of their good works shine before others. Through baptism we are sent into the world to shine with the light of Christ.

**Isaiah 58:1-9a, Psalm 112:1-9, 1 Corinthians 2:1-12, Matthew 5:13-20**

**February 14th & 15th**

Today's festival is a bridge between the Advent-Christmas-Epiphany cycle that comes to a close today and the Lent-Easter cycle that begins in several days. On a high mountain Jesus is revealed as God's beloved Son, echoing the words at his baptism. This vision of glory sustains us as Jesus faces his impending death in Jerusalem. We turn this week to Ash Wednesday and our yearly baptismal journey from Lent to Easter. Some churches put aside the alleluia at the conclusion of today's liturgy. This word of joy will be omitted during the penitential season of Lent and will be sung again at Easter.

**Exodus 24:12-18, Psalm 2, Psalm 99, 2 Peter 1:16-21, Matthew 17:1-9**

**February 21st & 22nd**

Today's gospel tells of Jesus' temptation in the desert. His forty-day fast becomes the basis of our Lenten pilgrimage. In the early church Lent was a time of intense preparation for those to be baptized at the Easter Vigil. This catechetical focus on the meaning of faith is at the heart of our Lenten journey to the baptismal waters of Easter. Hungry for God's mercy, we receive the bread of life to nourish us for the days ahead.

**Genesis 2:15-17, 3:1-7, Psalm 32, Romans 5:12-19, Matthew 4:1-11**

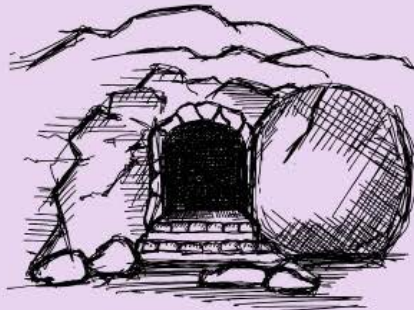

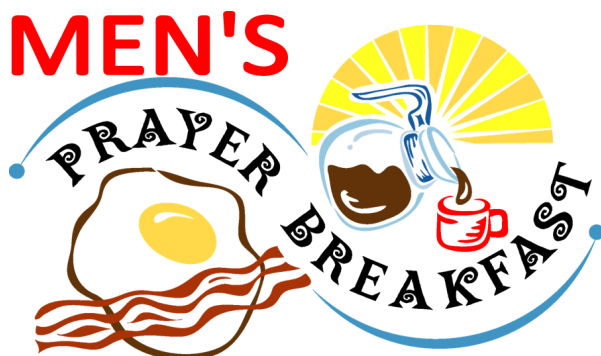
