## Evangelical Lutheran Church in America

You may have seen in a recent midweek email my announcement that the Education/Youth & Family Ministry Committee has decided to end our Wednesday Evening Youth Programming. Peace Youth has been on hiatus for a few months now, and Peace Pals had its last session on April 29. We have also decided to end the Refuel Meals.

As I have talked about this decision with people in the congregation, many have expressed a degree of sadness- Peace Pals, Peace Youth, and Refuel Meals have been a midweek anchor at Peace for a number of years. People have put in a great deal of energy, time, and love to help share faith and life with the children of the congregation. The Education/Youth & Family Ministry Committee, the Church Council, and I want to thank you for your support of these ministries over the years.

Along with sadness there has been a renewed sense of hope and joy. Some years ago, when Peace moved its focus from Sunday School to Midweek Youth events, we did so because it was apparent that was where our energy most needed to be focused at the time. We are making the switch back now because it is apparent that our energy and focus are most needed with our weekend faith formation- Godly Play for the younger kids, Confirmation for the older kids, Parents of Peace for families of all ages. We have seen in the first year of Godly Play that the kids are getting so much out of the curriculum. They are telling us bible stories, remembering names of biblical figures, talking about Jesus and his ministry in the world. The hope and joy congregational leadership is feeling doesn't negate the sadness of ending midweek youth programming, but it does reflect the work we have been doing this year to develop Godly Play.

The same can be said of my experience teaching the confirmands. We have had three middle- and high-school students who have attended Confirmation this year. Each of the adults who have volunteered to help have said some variation of the same thing: “These kids are really engaged with their learning!” We will add at least two more confirmands in the fall, with a special one-year confirmation class for a pair of students who will graduate high school next Spring. I have been so pleased with growth, understanding, and willingness to learn that these students have shown over these past months.

While it certainly is sad that we will be moving away from midweek youth programming, I agree with the assessment of the Education/Youth & Family Ministry Committee that this refocus will help us manage our resources more sustainably as we continue to grow with Godly Play and Confirmation. Just as we have asked for your help to support Peace Pals, Peace Youth, and Refuel, we will continue to ask for your prayers, financial donations, and volunteering to support these programs to help raise our children in faith.

With this adjustment, we hope that we can continue to build faithful disciples for Christ of all ages, especially as we provide a strong foundation for the children of our congregation and community. Thank you for understanding this change, and please feel free to contact me with any feedback you may have.

It was noted at the most recent council meeting that monthly giving has been steady over the course of the last few years. It seems that we have reached a "new normal" after the shock of the COVID Pandemic began six years ago. Because of this steady expected income, council has been able to plan expenses and use general funds and designated funds to keep our expenses in check. You'll see that both the March income/expense difference and the Year-To-Date difference are in the positive! With Easter in April this year, we are expecting to see that difference grow in an eve more positive way. Thank you to everyone who continues to give regularly. Because of your generosity, Peace is continuing the ministries it has set forth, and is able to support ministries with which we have begun new relationships.

As we approach summer, this is our regular reminder that giving tends to decline in May-August, simply because not as many people are in worship due to travel and vacationing. You may see these numbers decrease somewhat, but with the strong foundation from the first months of 2026, we should continue to show a strong budget into the warmer months.

## **Saturday, May 2 & Sunday, May 3, 2026**

In words and deeds we bear witness to the risen Christ—our way, our truth, our life.

## **Saturday May 9 & Sunday, May 10, 2026**

Jesus does not abandon his followers. Through the Holy Spirit, Jesus comes to abide with his disciples of every generation. As Pentecost draws near, we are reminded that the risen Christ dwells in us as the Spirit of truth. We receive this Spirit in baptism and pray that in our gathering around the Lord's table the Spirit will transform us to be the body of the risen Christ in the world.

## **Saturday, May 16 & Sunday, May 17, 2026**

In these days between Ascension and Pentecost, we gather with the disciples in the upper room, waiting for the Spirit to transform the church around the world. In today's gospel Jesus prays for his followers and for their mission in his name. Amid religious, social, and economic divisions, we seek the unity that Jesus had with his Father. Made one in baptism, we go forth to live our faith in the world, eager for the unity that God intends for the whole human family.

Acts 1:6-14, Psalm 68:1-10, 32-35, 1 Peter 4:12-14,5:6-11, John 17:1-11

## **Saturday, May 23 & Sunday, May 24, 2026**

Pentecost derives its name from the Jewish festival celebrating the harvest and the giving of the law on Mount Sinai fifty days after Passover. Fifty days after Easter, we celebrate the Holy Spirit as God's presence within and among us. In Acts the Spirit arrives in rushing wind and flame, bringing God's presence to all people. Paul reminds us that though we each have different capacities, we are unified in the Spirit that equips us with these gifts. Jesus breathes the Holy Spirit on his disciples, empowering them to forgive sin. We celebrate that we too are given the breath of the Holy Spirit and sent out to proclaim God's redeeming love to all the world.

Acts 2:1-21, Psalm 104:24-34, 35b, 1 Corinthians 12:3b-13, John 20:19-23

## **Saturday, May 30 & Sunday, May 31, 2026**

Though the word trinity is not found in the scriptures, today's second reading includes the apostolic greeting that begins the liturgy: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all. In the gospel Jesus sends his disciples forth to baptize in the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. More than a doctrine, the Trinity expresses the heart of our faith: we have experienced the God of creation made known in Jesus Christ and with us always through the Holy Spirit. We celebrate the mystery of the Holy Trinity in word and sacrament, as we profess the creed, and as we are sent into the world to bear witness to our faith.

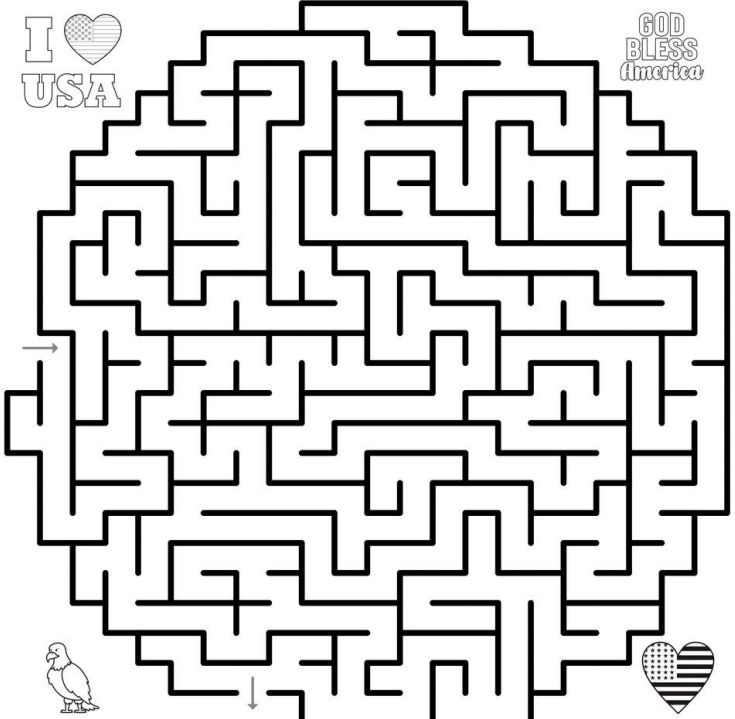

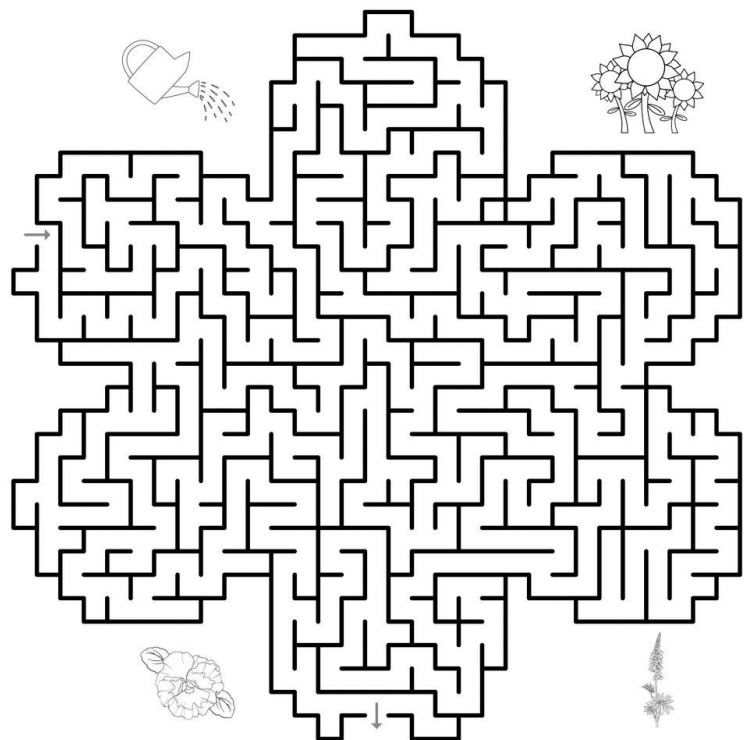
